From the Rector's Desk...

When you have elementary age children in the 21st century, just about every weekend is filled with one birthday party after another. I've lost count of how many parties Charles and Mary Claire have attended since the start of the school year. And I can tell you this: They look forward to every last one of them!

As we start to get a little older, it's those "milestone birthdays" that either excite or terrify us. The 16th birthday. The 21st birthday. The 30th birthday. The 50th birthday. God-willing we get to keep counting upward and hit those next milestones, each with their own opportunities and challenges.

On June 24, 1923, the Feast of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, Bishop Edwin S. Lines came to Ridgewood to officiate at the very first service of our parish. As the church had not yet been dedicated, the clergy present on that day put on their vestments in house located at 127 Fairmount Avenue. From there, the 368 people processed the short distance from that house to the church, and the rest, as they say, is history.



This summer, we celebrate one of those major milestone birthdays: the 100th anniversary of the dedication of our church. To pay homage to those first St. Elizabethians, we'll process from that very same house on Fairmount Road (they've given us their permission) and sing some of the same hymns from that very first service. Most importantly, we'll give thanks to Almighty God for our beginnings and all that has happened from 1923 to 2023. It will be a very special day, and I hope you will mark your calendars and join us on June 25 as we celebrate this important birthday.

And then, we will begin our 101st year. This year may not be as exciting a milestone, but it is no less important. In our 101st year we will talk more as a parish about how we can continue to strengthen and grow. We will also discuss what we need to do to take care of these beautiful facilities that have been entrusted to us and come up with a vision for the next centenary.

Warren Buffett, the Oracle of Omaha, once said that "Someone is sitting in the shade today because someone planted a tree a long time ago." 100 years ago, our ancestors in the faith had a vision: a modest parish house in Upper Ridgewood. That vision very quickly turned into a chapel, which then turned into it's own self-sustaining parish just a few years later. They had a vision and they had a plan. They put their trust in God and we are the beneficiaries. What trees are we planting as we look to the future? What are our dreams as we move closer to the next milestone in our church's life?

It's no secret that St. Elizabeth's is one of the healthiest churches in our diocese. I don't say that in an arrogant way but simply as a matter of fact. Yes, we have our challenges, but we are a strong, dynamic church with a bright future ahead of us. The reason we are so strong and vibrant is because we, to quote Stephen Covey, have "kept the main thing the main thing." And what is the main thing? Jesus Christ our Lord. We have, as we are encouraged to do in the New Testament, grown in the grace and knowledge of Jesus our Lord [see 2 Peter 3.18]. That's it. That's why we're still here. All that we've done over the last 100 years, and all that we will continue to do as we move into the future is connected to the Good News of Jesus Christ.

We've made it to 100 and we are grateful to God. As we come to the end of our Centennial Celebrations on June 25, let's not stop planting and dreaming together as we journey ever forward. And as we go, we will keep our eyes and our hearts and our church always fixed on what really matters: Jesus our Lord and Savior.

Happy birthday, St. Elizabeth's! You look better than ever and we're all excited to see what's next for you, our beloved church.
