Stewardship Update

We are into our 6th week of our fall Stewardship season. Thank you to those who have already made their pledge for 2025. To date we have received 101 pledges, totaling \$931,045 pledged for 2025's budget. Pledge cards have been mailed out to home addresses on file.
