St. Elizabeth's Chapel

AT the time that St. Bartholomew's Parish was formed, about nine years ago, from the Parish Mission formerly conducted by Christ Church of Ridgewood, in Hohokus, a number of the residents of Upper Ridgewood took considerable interest in it, and thereafter the number from that section attending services in Hohokus grew steadily, but not until after the advent of Dr. Carson, as Rector of Christ Church was the Upper Ridgewood Section definitely assigned to St. Bartholomew's Parish.

Realizing the importance of keeping in the Parish, the growing support of Upper Ridgewood, the Rector, Wardens and Vestrymen suggested, to a specially called Parish Meeting early last year, the erection by the Parish of a Chapel in Upper Ridgewood, that would be a part of St. Bartholomew's Parish. This suggestion having met with the approval of this meeting, a committee was appointed to canvass the entire Parish for pledges for this work. The results of this canvas showing that the proposition could be financed, especially as the needed property was donated, the approval of the Bishops of the Diocese, and the Rector, Wardens and Vestrymen of Christ Church was obtained, an architect was engaged, plans drawn and the work started on St. Elizabeth's Chapel.

As the work has progressed, the cost of the building has gone far beyond the original estimated cost, but through the generosity of the members of the Parish, and a gift of one thousand dollars from the Bishop's Fund, the committees in charge of the building have succeeded in constructing a Chapel, second to none, with the assistance of a loan from the American Church Building Fund Commission, at a cost approximating Thirty Thousand Dollars for the building alone.

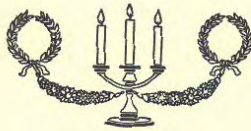

In order to co-ordinate the fittings of the Chapel a special committee was appointed to confer with those desiring to make gifts, and this committee feels that the Parish should be greatly pleased and proud to offer to the Bishop at this time, all of the articles mentioned in the Dedication Service.

To Mr. Wallace G. Carr, one of our Parishioners, the thanks of the Parish are justly due, for his faithful service in supervising the erection of the Chapel.

To a stranger to us all and a casual acquaintance of Mr. Thomson's on the "Majestic," we are indebted for a donation of One Hundred Dollars to establish a fund to be used at some future date as a mark of appreciation to our first Rector. Realizing the sacredness of their trust, the committee appointed to arrange for the memorials, consisting of Mr. Kohler and Mr. Richards, will be very glad to meet privately those who may care to assist in bringing this fund up to say at least Fifteen Hundred Dollars.
