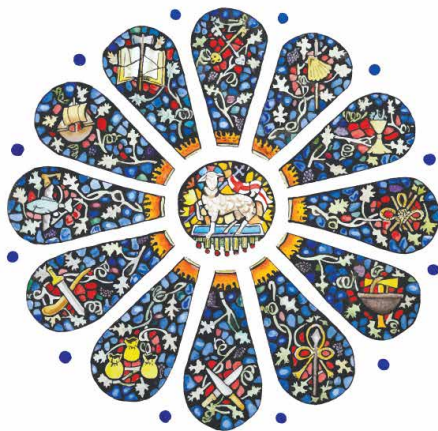

THE FIRST LESSON

Ephesians 1:11-23

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the

head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

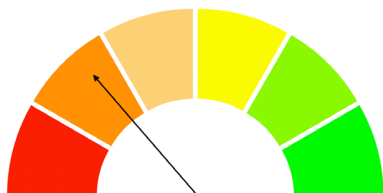

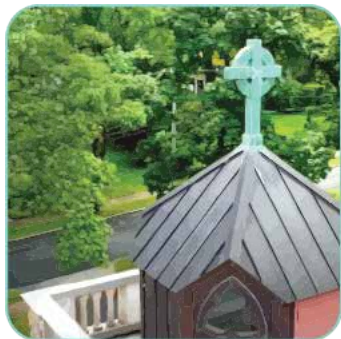

New: Project Showcase: Take a tour of the organ Sunday, November 9 Organ Showcase

Stay for a very special postlude at the end of the 10 a.m. service, followed by a tour! Mark your calendar! St. Elizabeth's is fortunate to have an excellent organ, built for us in the 1980s. But did you know that our organ was never completed? And that it is in need of costly repairs? Our organist and choirmaster Garah Landes and fellow professional George Swope – St. Elizabeth's organ consultant for over 20 years and a regular guest musician at our church – are conducting organ tours to show off our quality instrument and explain the proposed repairs and upgrades. This is an exciting opportunity to spend time with our experts and get an up-close and personal look at our wonderful and fascinating instrument. Stay for a showcase tour after church on Sunday, November 9 or come out on Thursday, November 13 at 10 a.m. (before Needlecrafters) or 11:30 a.m. (after Moms Group). No signup needed!

Prepare the Way is a \$1.6 million dollar fundraising effort focused on building upgrades and improvements to our century-old sanctuary and other spaces. Today's parishioners and future generations will enjoy an enhanced worship experience through the installation of air conditioning, the completion of the original church organ plan plus necessary repairs, the replacement of the roof, the addition of insulation, and preservation work on our beloved stained glass windows.
